## Four groups Jesus addresses

**Crowds** – in town for festival; mix of Jew/Gentile; unaware of decision to kill Jesus

**Jews-** in town for festival

People of Jerusalem

Jews living in Jerusalem; aware of decision to kill Jesus

Actively attempting to kill Jesus

—Pharisees

#### Jesus and the One Who Sent Him

#### ■ When they challenge His authority to teach:

- My teaching is not my own. It comes from the one who sent me.
- He who seeks the glory of the one who sent him is a man of truth

#### ■ When they question His Messianic qualifications:

- I am not here on my own authority, but he who sent me is true. You do not know him, but I know him because I am from him and he sent me.

#### ■ When they attempt to arrest Him:

- I am with you for only a short time, and then I am going to the one who sent me.



Are you aware of your sent-ness?

# Recognize your boundary lines

- Think of places where you live and work
- **Live** not just street address, but where you live your life- restaurants, gym, shops, bank, barber, etc.
- Work- not just paid, but where you give your time/energy- PTA, coaching little league, etc.
- Think of the people you encounter in those places
- That combination is where you are sent



## Assume you are sent

- Trust sovereignty of God in these areas- vast majority need make no changes
- Trust God to initiate change if it is needed- He is the Sender and perfectly capable of moving us into new places; remember Jonah
- Trust that you have something to give- live your life with your eyes open, not your head down
