Self-Portrait

What You Need

Paper plates (or a sheet of paper) and various crafting materials: markers/crayons, scissors, glue sticks, tape

What You Do

Gather the family around a table. Place the crafting supplies in the middle. Encourage everyone to make a self-portrait using the paper plate for a face. Add hair with ribbon, string, or yarn. Cut out eyes, nose, and mouth from construction paper. Or, just draw everything with crayons or markers. Write "God Made Me" on a piece of paper and hang it on the wall. Hang the family's self-portraits underneath.


What You Say

"Let's make self-portraits! A self-portrait is when you create a picture that looks like you. We're going to use these craft supplies to make our faces on these paper plates. Don't forget your eyes. What color hair do you have? God made each and every part of you.

Morning Time

hen you go into your child's room, say, "God made the sun and sky so blue. God made me, and God made you!" Tickle your child when you say, "you."



Drive Time

s you drive, challenge your child to A try and count the number of hairs on their head. When they give up or give you a random number, say, "Guess what! God knows exactly how many hairs are on your head! One, God knows everything. And two, you are SO important to God that He even thinks about how many hairs are on your head. I think that is pretty amazing!"



Cuddle Time

r uddle with your child this month and pray, "Dear God, thank You for loving us SO much that You sent Your Son, Jesus, to be our friend forever. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen."



Bath Time

dd toy plates, utensils, and food A to bathtime so your child can pretend to cook breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Talk about how we can talk to God during breakfast time, lunch time, and dinner time. We can even talk to God during playtime, bedtime, and bath time! We can talk to God anytime, anywhere, about anything!
