

Talk about it!

Say: God made you a great helper!





Bible Story

Timothy and Tabitha (1 Timothy 4:12; Acts 9:36-39)

Remember This

"I am fearfully and wonderfully made." Psalm 139:14, NIV

Say This

Who made you? God made me!

Activity

Sock Match

What You Need

Six (or more) pairs of socks in different colors

What You Do

Place one of each pair of socks around the room. Place the other socks in a pile in the middle of the room. Pick up one sock out of the pile and ask your child to find the match and bring it to you. Place the pair together. Pick up a second sock and repeat. Continue until all of the socks are matched.

What You Say

"Oh no! All of these socks have lost their match. I need your help! Can you help me find the matches? (Hold up one sock.) Look at this sock. Look around the room and see if you can find the match.

"You all are so good at helping! Today we learned about a lady named Tabitha. She loved God and helped by making clothes for people who needed them. God made us to help. It doesn't matter if we are a grown-up or a kid, we can help. God made you and loves you so much. **Who made you? God made me.**"

Prayer

"Dear God, helping people feels so good. Thank You for making us all to be helpers, no matter how old or young we are. Help us to look for ways we can help and then do it, just like Tabitha did. We love You. In Jesus' name, amen."





1. LOOK AT YOU

WHAT YOU NEED: child safe mirrors

BIBLE WORDS

"I am fearfully and wonderfully made." **PSALM 139:14, NIV** WHAT YOU DO: Sit with your child and look in mirrors. Have them point to different parts of their bodies. Continue as long as there is interest.

WHAT YOU SAY: "Look at these mirrors. Let's look at ourselves in them. Can you point to your legs? Great job! God made your legs. Can you point to your arm? Great job! God made your arms. (Continue with additional instructions.) The Bible teaches us that God made you and me and everyone."

BOTTOM LINE

God made you.

2. WONDERFULLY MADE

WHAT YOU DO: Sit together with your child and ask them to wiggle their ears. Say "God made your ears." Ask them to shake their arms. Say "God made your arm." Ask them to jump up and down. Say "God made your legs to jump up and down." Continue as long as there is interest.

BASIC TRUTH

God made me.

WHAT YOU SAY: "Come and sit with me. God made you so special! Show me how you wiggle your ears. God made your ears.

Show me how you shake your arm. God made your arm. Show me how you jump up and down. God made your legs. Show me how you blink your eyes. God made your eyes. Show me how you clap your hands. God made your hands. You are special because God made you."

3. GOD MADE

WHAT YOU DO: Speak or sing (with mask on) the following to the tune of "Where is Thumbkin?"

Song Lyrics-Post over changing table or in your child's bedroom!

4. STACK THE BLOCKS

WHAT YOU NEED: blocks

WHAT YOU DO: Gather your child to play with blocks. Stack them up! Each time they put a block on the stack, say a word from the phrase, "God made you." Continue as long as there is interest.


WHAT YOU SAY: "Let's play with this toy together. Can you stack a block? God. Can you stack another block? Loves. Can you stack another block? You. Good job! God made you. Yeah, God made you! (Clap.) Let's knock over our tower and do it again."
