


### **Morning Time**

# **Discussion Questions**

• How did Daniel show integrity in this passage?

• Why do you think Daniel chose to follow God even when he didn't have to? How did it turn out for him when he made that choice?

• What if you were guaranteed you wouldn't get caught if you lied – why would it still be important to choose to be truthful? For example: You drop your mom's phone and the screen shatters. She asks you if you know who did it. What are the consequences of lying? What could happen if you tell the truth? (This is an important opportunity to discuss we can't choose the consequences of showing integrity, but independent of the consequences, God asks us to choose to be truthful whatever we do, to have integrity.)

• What do we mean when we talk about, "Who somebody is on the inside"?

• Who is somebody you know who has integrity? How would you describe that person?

It doesn't make you a bad parent to ask for help, it makes you a better parent.
