Activity

In and Out

What You Need

A Hula Hoop or masking tape

What You Do

Make a large circle with the tape in the middle of the activity area. Tell your child to stand outside the circle. Then say, "IN" and have them jump into the circle and yell, "God's got it!" Then say, "OUT" and have them jump out of the circle. Repeat as long as there is interest.

What You Say


"Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego loved and obeyed God. They would not bow down to King Nebuchadnezzar's statue, so he had them thrown into the furnace. A furnace is a room that's like a fireplace. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego knew that God was with them and that no matter what happens, God's got it. Let's pretend that this circle is the furnace in our Bible story today. Let's jump in and say, 'God's got it.' Nice job! Now, jump out! Let's do it again!"

"God was with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and saved them from the fire. God listens to us and is always there when we need Him! God's got it. **Who's got it? God's got it!**"

"Dear God, You are SO big and powerful, and You really can be with us wherever we go. You can be with us when we go to the doctor, on a walk, or even when we go to sleep. Only YOU can do that! DAILY CUES



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, say, "Good morning! It's a new day to trust that God's got it! God's got (mommy, daddy). God's got (name of child). God's got it!"



Drive Time

Get a small basket and put some snacks in it for your child to have when they return from a walk or a drive. When you get home, tell them they can eat the snacks you put in the basket. Talk about how baby Moses' mommy put him in a basket to keep him safe. God sent the Princess of Egypt to help take care of him.



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child this month and pray, "Dear God, Thank You for another wonderful day with (name of child). Help us to keep doing what is right, and no matter what happens, trust that You've got it. You are so big and powerful, God, and You love us A LOT! You're the best, and we love You. In Jesus' name, amen."



Bath Time

Add toy boats and a watering can to bathtubtime. Show your child how to "make it rain" on the boats using the watering can. Talk about how God kept Noah, his family, and the animals safe in the big boat. After God dried up all of the water, He put a rainbow in the sky to show His promise to never flood the world again. And God always keeps His promises!
