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**4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Weekly Overview – Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup>**

**Scripture:** Genesis 12:1-3, 15:1-6, Psalm 67

**Key Question:** When do God's promises matter?

**SB Kids Essential Truth:** Matthew 7:7-11

**Big Idea:** This week we'll be looking at the story of God's promise to Abram, who later becomes Abraham. This is the promise that Abram's offspring would spread, covering the whole Earth there would be so many. This week, we'll look at how God's promises remain over time, even when we least expect them.

**Monthly Memory Verse:** Joshua 21:45 – Not one of all the Lord's good promises to Israel failed; every one was fulfilled.

## SMALL GROUP SCHEDULE

**9:25-9:40/10:55-11:10** – Greet kids as they enter the large group room. Help with the game and try and make sure to greet all of your small group members. Kids and leaders should keep masks on during this time.

**9:40-9:55/11:10-11:25** – Lead the kids by example in worship. When they see you engage in worship, it encourages them to engage. We want to lead them to worship in spirit and in truth.

**9:55-10:10/11:25-11:40** – Teaching time in separate preteen space. Kids will leave masks on until seated 6ft apart, then they can take their masks off.

**10:10-10:30/11:40-12:00** – Small group time. We'll mask back up, each group will head to their room, and we'll have some activity and discussion time. Kids and leaders must keep masks on at all times when they are less than 6 feet apart from each other. Parents will pick up their kids from small group rooms. Kids and leaders should wear masks for dismissal in classrooms and in hallways.

## SMALL GROUP ACTIVITIES

### ACTIVITY 1: DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What did God tell Abram to do?
- Do you feel like God has ever asked you to do something?
- What did God promise Abram?
- Do you feel like God has made any promises to you?
- Read Genesis 15:6 – *Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness.* Abram believed God, though he had plenty reasons to doubt. Do you sometimes find it hard to believe God?
- Can you think of a promise from God that is for now?
- Can you think of a promise from God that is for later?
- How can we know more about God's promises?

## **ACTIVITY 2: PSALM 67**

**WHAT YOU NEED:** Bibles

### **WHAT YOU DO:**

- This week, we're going to use Psalm 67 and pray over the students.
- Tell the kids that we're about to enter a time of prayer, so to all grab a bible and open it up to Psalm 67.
- Remind the students that King David wrote the Psalms as a way to praise and honor God, and we can use them for that too.
- Then, open up in prayer, and start calling on members of the small group to read a couple verses at a time, stopping them and asking somebody else to read every couple of verses.
- When finished, close in prayer, thanking God for the promises he has made and kept in our, and their, lives.
