Matthew 13

- 3rd major sermon in Matthew
- Collection of parables focused on the dynamics of the Kingdom of God in the present age
- Parable everyday story taken from real life that communicates spiritual truth; often has surprise/twist
- Parables in Ch 13 Answering:
 - If Jesus is the Messiah, then why is He being rejected?
 - Why isn't the Kingdom Jesus is establishing making more of an impact?



Parable of the Sower

- Seed Gospel; Good News about Jesus and His Kingdom
- Sower one scattering seed; sharers of the Gospel
- **Soil** recipients of the seed; hearers of the Gospel
- Note as followers of Jesus we are both sower and soil
 - we are called to share Good News of Jesus with others
 - The Holy Spirit is constantly leading us into more truth about Jesus and His Kingdom



Unproductive Soil

- Hard resistant to the Gospel; never accepts; no 'plant' grows
- Ground can be softened
 - Through rain ask the Holy Spirit to keep your heart open to His leading
 - With a plow circumstances can 'break' us causing us to be more open to the Holy Spirit



Unproductive Soil

Initial acceptance, but no fruit

- Rocky shallow; roots of plant not deep enough to withstand:
 - Trouble squeezing
 - **Persecution** harassment
 - For us disappointment over loss

Is Jesus worth suffering for?

• C.S. Lewis: Our cause is never more in danger than when a human, no longer desiring, but still intending, to do our Enemy's (God's) will, looks round upon a universe from which every trace of Him seems to have vanished, and asks why he has been forsaken, and still obeys.





Unproductive Soil

Initial acceptance, but no fruit

Weedy – crowded; plant choked out

- Worries of this life usually people/circumstances we care about but can't control
 - Do not worry worry is counterproductive; practice trust
- Deceitfulness of wealth for us the great lie is that money is not dangerous to our souls
 - Hard for the rich to enter the Kingdom - love of money is root of all kinds of evil; practice generosity
