- 3rd major sermon in Matthew
- Collection of parables focused on the dynamics of the Kingdom of God in the present age
- Parable everyday story taken from real life that communicates spiritual truth; often has surprise/twist
- Parables in Ch 13 answering:
 - If Jesus is the Messiah, then why is He being rejected?
 - Why isn't the Kingdom Jesus is establishing making more of an impact?

- The Man Who Sowed Good Seed Jesus
- The Field The World
- Good Seed People of the Kingdom
- Weeds People of the evil one
- The Enemy The Devil
- The Servants The Disciples
- The Harvest- The End of The Age (When Christ Returns to rule and reign)





Parable of the Weeds

The Servants - The Disciples
They are confused by the rise in opposition
and the seemingly backsliding ministry of
Jesus-

- Expectation of Messiah as Conquering King (Zechariah 14)
- Despite seemingly contradictory prophesies foretelling a Suffering Servant (Isaiah 53)
- Some of the Jewish rabbis even suggested that there would be two Messiahs, a humble, suffering one and a conquering, reigning one; but no one was suggesting that the same Messiah would come twice, once to suffer and once to reign.





Parable of the Weeds

The Harvest- The End of The Age (When Christ Returns to rule and reign)

 Jesus is communicating to his disciples that in his Kingdom in the current age- his people will grow up in the midst of the weeds, and in the age to come there will be a separation of good and evil.

Parable of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast

Mustard Seed and Yeast -

 Two seemingly insignificant things that bring about great change





Jesus' Objective

- Jesus is addressing the confusion and concerns of the disciples that find themselves surrounded by weeds and opposition
- Jesus is addressing the question that has often lived in the hearts of his people:
 - Didn't you sow good seed?
 - How long O God will my enemies prevail against me?
 - How long will the wicked prosper and the righteous suffer?

Types of conflicts in story

- Man vs Self (sin, temptation, addiction)
- Man vs Man (robbed, abused, neglected)
- Man vs Society (political parties)
- Man vs Nature (Sickness and death)
- Man vs Supernatural (all of the above)
