
- Nazarenes one of us; carpenter's son, Mary's son, brother of ...

MATTHEW 15:1-20



Two Foundational Issues:

Authority of the Tradition of the Elders (Oral Law)

- Oral Law rabbinical interpretations of Written Law (613 commands found in OT); intended to provide clarity to Written Law
- Pharisees as binding as Written Law

Source of spiritual defilement

Pharisees – emphasis on externals

Combined – ceremonial handwashing was part of Oral Law intended to keep people from becoming unclean due to eating food with unclean hands





Threefold Response

- Obeying the Traditions of the Elders (Oral Law) can lead to disobeying the commands of God (Written Law)
- The Pharisees are hypocrites –
 misperceptions about God are leading
 to behavior that is distancing them
 from Him
- The source of our defilement is internal (what comes out of our hearts) not external (what we put into our stomachs)

MATTHEW 15:1-20



Proverbs 4.23 - Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.

- Guard protect, watch over
- Hearts are accessed through eyes and ears
 - Mt 12 Make a tree good and its fruit will be good, or make a tree bad and its fruit will be bad, for a tree is recognized by its fruit... A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him.

 Be discerning without being pharisaical





Phil 4.8 - Finally, brothers and sisters,

- whatever is true conforms to reality;
 is aligned with God and His Kingdom
- whatever is noble worthy of respect, honor, above reproach
- whatever is right just in God's sight
- whatever is pure morally blameless
- whatever is lovely causes delight, pleasing
- whatever is admirable commendable
- if anything is excellent virtuous
- or praiseworthy— worthy of approval or recognition
- think about such things carefully ponder, let one's mind dwell on
