- *Kairos* opportune time/right time; these are moments in which God often works



List kairos moments from 2025:


- **Milestones** births, deaths, graduations, etc.
- **Transitions** new home, new job, new relationship, marriage, divorce, etc.
- **Surprises** medical diagnosis, promotion, accident, etc.; (may not be major a book you read or conversation you had where God spoke)

Let us throw off the sin that so easily entangles (controls tightly)

- **sins of the body** external behaviors
- **sins of the heart** internal attitudes/dispositions

I thank You that in light of Jesus' work on the cross death is not the final word. I grieve these losses, but I grieve as one who has hope.




Acknowledgement of Hurts
